A group of young people were doing a class project at Harvard University when they thought about inventing something to create cheap, clean electricity for poor children around the world. There are many parts of the world where people live without electricity. Around 1.3 billion people haven't got light when it gets dark. Many of these people are in South Asian and African countries. In some parts of Africa, 70% of people haven't got electricity. They have to use oil or wood to make light, and this isn't always cheap or easy. Otherwise, everything has to stop when it gets dark. This is a problem because, for example, children can't study, read or write with no light.

The students at Harvard started thinking. They wanted to make something to help young children living in parts of the world where people haven't got electricity. They thought some more. What do children like doing? They had a great idea – a football!
